The key presenter, **YASUO TERADA** is an internationally acclaimed master potter who is widely known for his years of research and practice in restoration of ancient kilns, which are integral part of Japanese ceramic traditions. His intrepid devotion to clay and raw materials for glaze are widely recognized and many have been inspired in numerous cities and countries he has visited. To our delight, Terada's keen interest in indigenous raw materials has prompted him to visit the Philippines for the first time.

Joining Terada is another master potter, **STEVE HARRISON**, who has an equally focused attention to local materials. Harrison, with his years of concentrated research for his work on clay, glazes and study into wood-fire kiln techniques has been much honored among potters and collectors. He enjoys an unmatched reputation for his methodological achievements and the aesthetic balance so apparent in his work.



The Workshop is an independent session from a series of workshops that the two master potters will be conducting in Sagada and Batangas from January 11 to 25, 2009. The workshop was organized to benefit particularly, the university community and the College of Fine Arts, in line with recent events to launch its new ceramic studio. The workshop is open as well to non-UP participants. It is intended to enrich knowledge on processing of local clay bodies and glazes and promote an appreciation of the aesthetic values and experience of ceramic arts and materials. The workshop will cover the following topics:

- Discussion of clay types: A demonstration of processing local clay samples.(Terada)
- Mixing glaze & glaze application: A demonstration of making glaze from rock dust. (Harrison)
- Comments on the CFA Ceramic Studio clay stock (Terada & Harrison)
